Purpose of consultancy:	To conduct detailed data analyses focusing on the thematic areas of youth and maternal health based on the 2022 Population and Housing Census							
Scope of work:	Background							
(Description of services, activities, or outputs)	The Government of Botswana through Statistics Botswana successfully completed the country's fully digitised enumeration of the 2022 Population and Housing Census [PHC] in March 2022. Following this successful completion, the census project transitioned to the data analysis and dissemination phase. As a lead partner to the National Statistics Office on census related matters, UNFPA Botswana Country Office remained at the forefront of coordinated UN support to the thematic data analysis phase. Specifically, UNFPA committed to supporting the thematic analysis and dissemination phases of the 2022 PHC. In that regard, the thematic analysis phase was completed under the overall guidance of the Census Analysis Review Committee, leading to the dissemination conference that took place June 11 - 13th, 2024 in Gaborone. The dissemination conference provided a platform for sharing findings from the census taking with regard to informing policies and programs at a macro and micro level while also providing an opportunity to dialogue and review recommendations from the findings. Following the successful dissemination conference, partners, research institutions and the private sector have been encouraged to access the census data for further and detailed analyses as relevant. From a UNFPA perspective, as the UN agency for sexual and reproductive health and rights [SRHR], this provides an opportunity for targeted data analysis especially focusing on the areas of young people and maternal health. This equally provides an opportunity for updating some key SRHR indicators including adolescent birth rate and maternal mortality ratio. It is against this background that UNFPA Botswana is seeking the services and expertise of an individual consultant to conduct detailed analyses of the census data from an SRHR perspective.							
	The main objective of the consultancy is to perform a detailed analysis of the 2022 PHC data to uncove trends, inequalities and determinants affecting a) youth and b) maternal health outcomes in Botswana providing evidence based recommendations for policy and programmatic interventions.

	The consultant will be responsible for the following tasks (not exhaustive); a) Data review and analysis - i) Conduct an initial review of the 2022 PHC data focusing on sustainable development goals and national development plan indicators relevant to youth and maternal health. ii) Perform a detailed statistical analysis to identify key health and economic trends, disparities, and social determinants impacting youth (ages 10 -24) and maternal health (women of reproductive age, 15 - 49). iii) Analyse data focusing on specific indicators including but not limited to:

- ii) Propose strategies for improving data collection, reporting and utilisation for future SRHR planning.
